Scheduled Business 5:34 p.m.

City Engineer Staci Belcastro provided a recap of February 24, 2025, council work session regarding the ongoing discussion of the condition of the city streets and possible funding options for improvements and maintenance. The City has appointed the Galardi Rothstein Group to develop a street maintenance fee, gather information needed for a local gas tax, and present a summary of their work and options that can be considered at the April 7 council work session. They have also hired Consor North America, Inc., to form a focus group and conduct a community-wide survey to get community input on a gas tax and street maintenance fees to be presented at the April 22 Transportation Advisory Commission and May 28 city council meeting. Once they have decided what the best option is, the council will have the option to prepare a ballot measure to place on the November ballot. Civil Engineer III Chris Cerklewski gave an overview on the paving projects the City will tackle this summer including the Salem Avenue, North Albany, and Elm Street Overlay Projects and gave a brief description of the new strategy based on the latest research to maintain city streets and save money over the long term.
