Operations Captain Buck Pearce from the Albany Police Department joined the meeting to talk to the commission about the logistics of the red-light cameras that have been installed in Albany.

Benton County Engineer Laurel Byer spoke to the commission about the federal funding they received to develop a Transportation Safety Action Plan. The goal is to identify intersections and stretches of road where there are frequent crashes or near missies to see if they can identify what is causing the incidents. Benton County is planning to host one online and three in-person open houses in April where community members can review the data that has been collected and interact with staff and consultants.
